#### **TESCO MEAL DEAL CHALLENGE WORKSHOP**

All Year 7 students were lucky enough to attend a workshop facilitated by Tesco on Wednesday this week. Students learned about Tesco as a company & employability skills. Students then worked in groups to develop their own Breakfast Meal Deal.

As a team they created a new Breakfast Meal Deal (BMD). The teams allocated different job roles including, Marketing Manager, Product Development Leads & Presentation Lead. Once the team was organised they created a BMD that included a main breakfast product e.g. hot/cold sandwich/wrap, fruit product and a drink. Each product included at least 5 ingredients, at least one food that would normally go to waste. Teams then created a poster to market their BMD.

Before presenting their ideas to the Tesco team groups were asked to think about the following: Does your BMD have a name/story behind it? How will you package the food? What type of employability skills did you use when developing your BMD as a team?

Winning teams won a  $\pm 5$  Tesco voucher for each team member. The Tesco team commented how delightful all the Barclay Academy Year 7 students were and how impressed they were with the students productivity and ideas. As a school we could not be prouder of them all. Finally a huge thank you to Tesco for coming to school.





#### IMPERIAL WAR MUSEUM



On Monday, Year 10 visited the Imperial War Museum in London. The museum is the world's leading museum of war and conflict. Founded while the First World War was still raging, it gives voice to the extraordinary experiences of ordinary people forced to live their lives in a world torn apart by conflict. Students attended a learning session on the

Holocaust which enriched their study of the topic for their GCSE course. It was great to see students engage with primary source material and discuss the importance of the Holocaust today. The students were respectful and inquisitive, it was great to see them getting involved.



### LATIN COMPETITIONS

The Latin department at Barclay are delighted to announce the winners of two competitions that Key Stage 3 students took part in this year.

#### Young Aesopi Competition - Year 7
