Y9/Y10 VISIT TO MALAGA, SPAIN

From Monday 4th - Thursday 7th March, some year 9 and 10 students enjoyed a cultural visit to Andalusia in southern Spain. We visited the historical city of Córdoba where we learned about the Caliphate of Cordoba in the Mosque-Cathedral and we visited the best-preserved synagogue in Andalusia, one of only three left in Spain since the expulsion of the Jews in 1492. In Málaga, we climbed up to the Gibralfaro Castle and visited the Alcazaba of Málaga to see where the Moors resided during their reign; we experienced the remains of a Roman theatre and we saw the impact Picasso's art has had on modern artists in the 'Echo of Picasso' exhibit in the Picasso museum. There was also a bit of time to relax on the Malagueta beach, which obviously was also a fantastic photo opportunity on the famous sign!















UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE VISIT

Eight Lucky Year 10 students spent a day at the University of Cambridge. The students gained important information about applying to Oxbridge and the life of a student at an Oxbridge college. Students visited the college library and were fortunate enough to have lunch in the prestigious Gonville & Caius dining hall following in the footsteps of past scholars including Sir Stephen Hawkins.

The day concluded with a trip to the University's Museum of Zoology. An interesting walk around the museum concluded with a session from a current PhD student discussing ecology and his route into that field.
