

### **Covid-19 Addendum to behaviour and attendance policy September 2020**

(A) School attendance is mandatory. The only exception will be pupils who are unable to attend in line with public health advice:

- Due to them self-isolating
- Due to them having Covid symptoms
- Due to a positive test result themselves
- Due to being in close contact with someone who has Coronavirus

It is the responsibility of all parents to actively engage with the NHS Test and Trace process. All parents must book a test if their child displays symptoms and not come into school. Pupils must self-isolate if they have been in close contact with someone who tests positive for coronavirus or if anyone in their household develops symptoms. Please inform the school immediately of the results of a test if your child or someone in your household tests positive. If someone tests negative, if they feel well and no longer have symptoms similar to coronavirus (COVID-19), they can stop self-isolating. If this was to occur please follow the 'stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection'

(B) Parents/Carers must ensure that their child is collected from school immediately if they develop Covid 19 symptoms whilst onsite

(C) Pupils may arrive onsite from 8:00 am but must arrive no later than 8.25 to begin lessons at 8.30am

(D) Pupils must move straight to their designated out door space, distancing at all times around the site and when engaging with staff and students

(E) Upon arrival if a student wants to remove their face covering and it is reusable it must be put into a plastic bag. If it is disposable it must be put into a bin upon arrival to school

(F) Pupils must sanitise or wash their hands at the following times:

- When first arriving in school
- Before and After eating
- After using the toilet
- After using any equipment
- When leaving school

(G) All students must if possible carry **hand sanitiser** (no larger than 50ml) **and tissues** for personal use.

(H) Pupils must implement the 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it' approach at all times

(I) Students may not approach a member of staff and be closer to them than 2m unless invited and unless you are passing in corridors

(J) A deliberate, knowing, serious or repeated failure on the part of students to follow guidance in relation to theirs and others' safety must be treated seriously. **Pupils demonstrating behaviours now considered more serious due to COVID-19 eg purposefully coughing, sneezing and spitting at/towards/over another person, deliberately not maintaining social distancing and deliberately mixing with pupils from other bubbles** will lead to exclusion, which ultimately could be permanent if deliberate attempts are made to jeopardise the safety of individuals in our community
